WHAT IS A CODE OF CONDUCT OR BEHAVIOUR?

A Code of Conduct or Behaviour has been described as a set of consistent guidelines for an acceptable standard of professional conduct.

A Code of Conduct or Behaviour will encourage players, coaches, officials, administrators, the media, parents and spectators to display control; respect and professionalism to all involved with the sport.

- ❑ Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from netball.
- ❑ Coaches, respect officials' decisions. Teach / instruct players and spectators to do likewise.
- ❑ Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, players could not participate.
- ❑ Play by the Rules and in the spirit of the game.
- ❑ Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain approach the official during a break or after the competition.
- ❑ Players, control your temper. Verbal or physical abuse of officials and sledging other players, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent are not acceptable behaviours in Netball.
- ❑ Verbal or physical abuse of officials by spectators, parents or coaches is not acceptable.
